FOOTBALL'S COMING HOME?

An ambitious project to bring youth football back to the Standish area and create a new multi-sport hub for the community has been launched.

The initiative, which is at an early stage, would see fields at Red Rock turned into



football pitches for the new home of Standish Panthers and possibly other football and sports clubs, and schools.

THE COMMITTEE OF STANDISH PANTHERS

WOULD WELCOME THE COMMUNITY OF STANDISH TO COMPLETE A POLL AS TO WHETHER THEY WOULD LIKE TO SEE A SPORTS HUB TO CREATE FOOTBALL AND OTHER SPORTING FACILITIES FOR THE COMMUNITY AT LAND OFF RED ROCK LANE.

Standish Panthers are in early discussions with the council to create a sports hub for the community of Standish off Red Rock Lane.

Standish Panthers was created in 2003 and has grown over the 22 years to over 315 players registered to the club.

We have over 40 teams at junior and open age football playing in Standish including Pine Villa and Standish St Wilfrids with no facilities that can support junior boys and girls football along with OA and other sports that will use the facilities.

The huge housebuilding programme across Standish has increased the number of

children, both boys and girls, who want to play football for Standish Football teams and there is an opportunity to support the demand.

Since May 2024, Panthers have had 116 enquiries from prospective players but have only been able to accept 18 due to the lack of training facilities.

Standish Panthers currently playing and training at 11 venues across the Wigan Borough – and we are finding it increasingly hard to find pitches, as well as other teams in Standish.

We are now in the fortunate position to have the opportunity to create our own football pitches at Red Rock Lane, which would have a huge impact on football and other sports in and around the Standish area to support the growing demand for boys and girls junior football with much needed training facilities for the club to grow and more importantly to survive and other clubs in Standish.

The proposals is to transform the land below the Leeds-Liverpool Canal into a series of pitches.

We have engaged with experts who are are guiding us through a full planning application with regards to the position of the pitches, the importance of the base for the 4G to support other sports as well as the access which we have engaged with a qualified traffic planning consultant to support and meet the Wigan Highway requirements.


The facilities will be made available to other local football clubs, rugby clubs and schools in the nearby area who will be able to train there in the week.

We have a major challenge on our hands to get planning permission and to help achieve this we really need the support from the people of Standish."

NEW HOUSING PLAN SET TO BE LODGED

Are another 150 new homes being lined up for Standish?

A news story expresses anger at another planning application for housing, which is due to be validated, for new homes off Rectory Lane.

The site is on green fields off Iron Drive – an extension to the existing Persimmon/Morris Homes estate.

This land is designated as "safeguarded" for future development, the same as

most of the land already built out by housing developers over the last decade.

The last two planning applications linked to housing for Standish were refused by Wigan Council's planning committee in October due to a lack of infrastructure in highways and health services in the village.

Nothing has changed since then so we are hoping the planning committee will refuse this one, too.

Standish Voice's comment in the news article is: "Standish has probably seen the highest proportion of homes added to its housing stock over the past decade than anywhere else in the North West. But there has been no enhancement of our road infrastructure over that time to cope with around 30 per cent more traffic.

"And our NHS primary care services have actually worsened over that 10 years, to the extent that the NHS locally has said our GP practice was in danger of being overwhelmed if there was any new housebuilding. Only a few weeks ago, Wigan's planning committee took the responsible decision to refuse new developments in Standish because of this."

We will post the details of the plan when it is published on Wigan Council's planning portal.

STANDISH CHRISTMAS MARKET IS A HUGE SUCCESS


Standish Christmas Market was another success in 2024 thanks to the whole community pulling together to stage the huge event.

WOOD FOLD SCHOOL SET TO EXPAND

Wood Fold primary school is set to expand by half as much again - despite concerns by the governors.

Wood Fold Primary School is moving towards having 90 more places from September due to the huge increase in Standish's population over the past decade.

Wigan Council cabinet has approved a proposal to admit 90 children each year in three forms starting from September – currently, it admits 60 in two forms.

The next stage is a planning application and if it is approved, buildings on the school site on Green Lane will be enlarged to take the extra children to a maximum capacity of 630 places in the school by 2029.

A council report says projections show from next year that Wood Fold, which is judged as Outstanding by Ofsted, would become even more oversubscribed, but the governors have written to the council saying they are sceptical about the figures. They also have expressed safety concerns due to increased traffic.


And in a recent public consultation about the proposals, only six responses favoured the plans, with 45 against, most stating worries about increased congestion.

PUB SET TO TRANSFORM INTO NEW RESAURANT

Hickory's Smokehouse - due to be created at Standish's Charnley Arms - is set to open in Spring.

The company behind the Southern American restaurant has applied for planning permission to refurbish the Almond Brook Road building - adding the distinctive design of the popular smokehouse chain.

The Hickory's brand is from the company that runs Greene King, owner of the Charnley, which is now closed.


They want to renovate and modify the building - which was once the site of Henry Africa's - with the creation of an entrance lobby, kitchen dry store, terrace and infilling of existing veranda, timber cladding/horizontal

boarding to elevations, weather vane, additional parking, accessible parking spaces and landscaping.

Work can start on refurbishing the building before the new additions are agreed and the restaurant to due to launch in Spring 2025.

The BBQ-style chain serves southern US cuisine, such as corn dogs, ribs and pulled pork with bespoke drinks including fresh milkshakes and cocktails.
